Here are some of my favorite seam finishes! Seam finishes will prevent your seam allowances from fraying and make your seams stronger, which will help your garment to last longer.




NOTE: For each of the following finishes (except for French Seam), you will start with a ½" seam, sewn with right sides together, and then proceed with the steps as shown.

1. Pink and Stitch Down

a) With a pinking shears, trim both seam allowances to $\frac{1}{4}$ ".

b) Press the seam open and press the seam allowances to one side. Stitch seam allowances down ¹/₈" away from the seam line.

2. Zigzag Finish


Using a zigzag stitch on your sewing machine, sew the edges of the seam allowances together so that one side of the zigzag goes off the fabric and the other stays on, catching the edges to prevent fraying.


OPTIONAL: You can also press the seam allowances to one side and stitch them down for additional seam strength.

3. Clean Finish

a) Press the seam open and the seam allowances apart.

b) Fold each seam allowance edge under, press, and stitch along the fold ("edgestitch") to secure each one in place.
